UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

Crystal Nix-Hines (Cal. No. 523)

Ordered, That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, with the concurrence of the Republican Leader, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Crystal Nix-Hines, of California, for the rank of Ambassador during her tenure of service as the United States Permanent Representative to the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization.

Ordered further, That there be 30 minutes for debate equally divided in the usual form on the nomination; that upon the use or yielding back of time the Senate proceed to vote without intervening action or debate on the nomination; the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table with no intervening action or debate; that no further motions be in order; that President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate then resume legislative session. Lael Brainard, of the District of Columbia, to be a Member of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System for a term of fourteen years from February 1, 2012;

Jerome H. Powell, of Maryland, to be a Member of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System for a term of fourteen years from February 1, 2014; and

Stanley Fischer, of New York, to be Vice Chairman of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System for a term of four years.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked on the Brainard, Powell, or Fischer nominations, at 1:45 p.m. on Thursday, June 12, 2014, all post-cloture time be expired and the Senate proceed to vote on confirmation of the nominations in the order listed.
