UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Neil M. Gorsuch (Cal. No. 33)

Ordered, That following Leader remarks on Wednesday, April 5, 2017, the Senate resume executive session for the consideration of the nomination of Neil M. Gorsuch, of Colorado, to be an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States.

Ordered further, That the debate time on the Gorsuch nomination during the Wednesday, April 5, 2017, session of the Senate be divided as follows: following Leader remarks until 11 a.m. be equally divided, that the time from 11 a.m. until 12 noon be under control of the Majority; the time from 12 noon until 1 p.m. be under control of the Minority.

Ordered further, That the debate time until 9 p.m. on Wednesday, April 5, 2017, be divided in one hour alternating blocks. (*Apr. 4, 2017.*)
