## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

*Ordered*, That following Leader remarks on Wednesday, October 4, 2017, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination of Eric D. Hargan, of Illinois, to be Deputy Secretary of Health and Human Services, with the time until 11 a.m. equally divided between the two Leaders or their designees.

*Ordered further*, That at 11 a.m. on Wednesday, October 4, 2017, notwithstanding the provisions of Rule XXII, the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the Hargan nomination occur.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the Hargan nomination, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived.

*Ordered further*, That if cloture is invoked, the Senate vote on confirmation of the Hargan nomination at 3:15 p.m. on Wednesday, October 4, 2017, with no intervening action or debate, that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

*Ordered further*, That upon disposition of the Hargan nomination, the Senate vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Randal Quarles, of Colorado, to be a Member of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System for the unexpired term of fourteen years from February 1, 2004.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the Quarles nomination, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived.

*Ordered further*, That if cloture is invoked, the Senate vote on confirmation of the Quarles nomination at 10 a.m. on Thursday, October 5, 2017, that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

*Ordered further*, That the time on the evening of Wednesday, October 4, 2017, be for debate on the Quarles and Cissna nominations, concurrently.

*Ordered further*, That the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Lee Francis Cissna, of Maryland, to be Director of United States Citizenship and Immigration Services, Department of Homeland Security, occur upon disposition of the Quarles nomination.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the Cissna nomination, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived.

*Ordered further*, That if cloture is invoked on the Cissna nomination, all post-cloture time be considered expired and the Senate vote on confirmation with no intervening action or debate, that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

*Ordered further*, That following disposition of the Cissna nomination, the Senate resume consideration of the nomination of Callista L. Gingrich, of Virginia, to be Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to the Holy See, with a vote on the motion to invoke cloture at 1:45 p.m. on Thursday, October 5, 2017.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the Gingrich nomination, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived.

*Ordered further*, That if cloture is invoked on the Gingrich nomination, the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, October 16, 2017. (*Oct. 2, 3, 2017*)
