## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

**Joseph Otting (Cal. No. 300)**  
**Donald C. Coggins, Jr. (Cal. No. 313)**  
**Dabney Langhorne Friedrich (Cal. No. 314)**

*Ordered,* That following Leader remarks on Thursday, November 16, 2017, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination of Joseph Otting, of Nevada, to be Comptroller of the Currency for a term of five years.

*Ordered further,* That at 11:30 a.m., notwithstanding Rule XXII, there be 30 minutes of post-cloture time remaining on the Otting nomination equally divided between the Leaders or their designees, and that following the use or yielding back of that time, the Senate vote on the confirmation of the nomination; that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

*Ordered further,* That following disposition of the Otting nomination, the Senate vote on the pending motions to invoke cloture on the nominations of Donald C. Coggins, Jr., of South Carolina, to be United States District Judge for the District of South Carolina, and Dabney Langhorne Friedrich, of California, to be United States District Judge for the District of Columbia, in the order filed, and that if cloture is invoked, the post-cloture time on the nominations run consecutively.

*Ordered further,* That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on the Coggins and Friedrich nominations, the mandatory quorums required under Rule XXII be waived. (*Nov. 9, 15, 2017.*)
