Ordered, That following morning business on Tuesday, June 18, 2019, notwithstanding the provisions of Rule XXII, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination of Sean Cairncross, of Minnesota, to be Chief Executive Officer, Millennium Challenge Corporation, and the cloture vote on the nomination occur at 12 noon.
