## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

### Justin Reed Walker (Cal. No. 457)

*Ordered further,* That if cloture is invoked, at 1:45 p.m., the Senate vote on the nomination with no intervening action or debate; that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.
