*Ordered further*, That at 11 a.m., all remaining post-cloture time on the Benjamin nomination be considered expired.

*Ordered further*, That following disposition of the Benjamin nomination, the Senate resume consideration of the nomination of Cindy K. Chung, of Pennsylvania, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Third Circuit.

*Ordered further*, That at 1:45 p.m., the cloture motions with respect to the Chung nomination and the nomination of Gina R. Mendez-Miro, of Puerto Rico, to be United States District Judge for the District of Puerto Rico, ripen.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on the Chung and Mendez-Miro nominations, the mandatory quorum calls required under Rule XXII be waived.
