UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

Sigal Mandelker (Cal. No. 94)
Brock Long (Cal. No. 108)
Marshall Billingslea (Cal. No. 97)

Ordered, That following Leader remarks on Tuesday, June 20, 2017, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination of Sigal Mandelker, of New York, to be Under Secretary for Terrorism and Financial Crimes.

Ordered further, That the time until the vote on the nomination of Brock Long, of North Carolina, to be Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency, Department of Homeland Security, be equally divided between the two Leaders or their designees.

Ordered further, That at 11 a.m., the Senate vote on confirmation of the Long nomination, with no intervening action or debate, that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

Ordered further, That the cloture motions on the Mandelker nomination and the nomination of Marshall Billingslea, of Virginia, to be Assistant Secretary for Terrorist Financing, Department of the Treasury ripen after disposition of the Long nomination. (*Jun. 15, 19, 2017.*)

Ordered, That with respect to the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Sigal Mandelker, of New York, to be Under Secretary for Terrorism and Financial Crimes, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*Jun. 15, 2017.*)

Marshall Billingslea (Cal. No. 97)

Ordered, That with respect to the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Marshall Billingslea, of Virginia, to be Assistant Secretary for Terrorist Financing, Department of the Treasury, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*Jun. 15, 2017.*)
