UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

J. Paul Compton, Jr. (Cal. No. 241) Owen West (Cal. No. 193)

Ordered, That following Leader remarks on Monday, December 18, 2017, the Senate proceed to executive session for consideration of the nominations of J. Paul Compton, Jr., of Alabama, to be General Counsel of the Department of Housing and Urban Development, and Owen West, of Connecticut, to be an Assistant Secretary of Defense, en bloc.

Ordered further, that there be 30 minutes of debate on the West nomination equally divided in the usual form and 120 minutes of debate on the Compton nomination equally divided in the usual form, with the debate time on the nominations to run concurrently.

Ordered further, That at 5:30 p.m. the Senate vote on confirmation of the nominations in the order listed, and that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (*Dec. 13, 14, 2017.*)

Jennifer Gillian Newstead (Cal. No. 430)

Ordered, That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Democratic Leader, the Senate proceed to executive session for the consideration of the nomination of Jennifer Gillian Newstead, of New York, to be Legal Adviser of the Department of State.

Ordered further, That there be 10 minutes of debate equally divided in the usual form, and that following the use or yielding back of time, the Senate vote on the nomination with no intervening action or debate, and that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.
