## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

### John C. Rood (Cal. No. 508)

*Ordered further*, That at 5 p.m., on January 3, 2018, the Senate proceed to executive session for consideration of the nomination of John C. Rood, of Arizona, to be Under Secretary of Defense for Policy.

*Ordered further*, That there be 30 minutes of debate, equally divided in the usual form, and that following the use or yielding back of time the Senate vote on the nomination with no intervening action or debate; that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, that no further motions be in order, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

*Ordered further*, That notwithstanding Rule XXXI, the nomination be held in status quo into the second session of the 115th Congress. (*Dec. 20, 21, 2017.*)
