## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

*Ordered,* That following Leader remarks on Tuesday, July 10, 2018, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination of Mark Jeremy Bennett, of Hawaii, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Ninth Circuit, post-cloture.

*Ordered further,* That the Senate recess from 12:30 p.m. until 2:15 p.m. to allow for the weekly conference meetings.

*Ordered further,* That all time during adjournment, Leader remarks, morning business, and recess count post-cloture on the Bennett nomination.

*Ordered further,* That at 2:15 p.m., notwithstanding the provisions of Rule XXII, all post-cloture time on the Bennett nomination be considered expired and the Senate immediately vote on the nomination; that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid on the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

*Ordered further,* That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on the nominations of Brian Allen Benczkowski, of Virginia, to be an Assistant Attorney General and Paul C. Ney, Jr., of Tennessee, to be General Counsel of the Department of Defense, the mandatory quorums required under Rule XXII be waived. (*Jun. 28, Jul. 9, 2018.*)

### **James Blew (Cal. No. 601)**

*Ordered,* That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Democratic Leader, the Senate proceed to executive session for the consideration of the nomination of James Blew, of California, to be Assistant Secretary for Planning, Evaluation, and Policy Development, Department of Education.
