## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

*Ordered*, That upon the conclusion of morning business on Tuesday, November 16, 2021, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of Graham Scott Steele, of California, to be an Assistant Secretary of the Treasury, post-cloture.

*Ordered further*, That at 11:30 a.m., all post-cloture time be expired and the Senate vote on confirmation of the Steele nomination.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on the nominations of Robert Farrell Bonnie, of Virginia, to be Under Secretary of Agriculture for Farm Production and Conservation and Brian Eddie Nelson, of California, to be Under Secretary for Terrorism and Financial Crimes, the mandatory quorum calls required under Rule XXII be waived.

*Ordered further*, That following the cloture vote on the Bonnie nomination, the Senate recess until 2:15 p.m. to allow for the weekly caucus meetings.

*Ordered further*, That if cloture is invoked on the Bonnie nomination, the vote on confirmation be at 2:30 p.m.

*Ordered further*, That if any nominations are confirmed during Tuesday's session, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (Nov. 4, 15, 2021.)

### **Jonathan Kanter (Cal. No. 491)**

*Ordered*, That notwithstanding the provisions of Rule XXII, if applicable, at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Republican Leader, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Jonathan Kanter, of Maryland, to be an Assistant Attorney General.

*Ordered further*, That there be 10 minutes for debate equally divided in the usual form on the nomination.

*Ordered further*, That upon the use or yielding back of time the Senate proceed to vote without intervening action or debate on the nomination.

*Ordered further*, That if the nomination is confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table with no intervening action or debate, that no further motions be in order to the nomination, that the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions, and the Senate then resume legislative session. (Nov. 4, 2021.)
