Mr. FORD, from the Committee on Rules and Administration, reported the following original resolution; which was placed on the calendar

RESOLUTION

To provide for the appointment of a committee to receive and to report evidence with respect to articles of impeachment against Judge Alcee L. Hastings.

1 *Resolved*, That pursuant to Rule XI of the Rules of Pro-
2 cedure and Practice in the Senate When Sitting on Impeach-
3 ment Trials, the Presiding Officer shall appoint a committee
4 of twelve senators to perform the duties and to exercise the
5 powers provided for in the rule.

6 SEC. 2. The Majority and Minority Leader shall each
7 recommend six members to the Presiding Officer for appoint-

1 ment to the committee. The committee shall designate one of
2 its members to be chairman and one of its members to be vice
3 chairman.

4 SEC. 3. The committee shall be deemed to be a standing
5 committee of the Senate for the purpose of reporting to the
6 Senate resolutions for the criminal or civil enforcement of the
7 committee's subpoenas or orders, and for the purpose of
8 printing reports, hearings, and other documents for submis-
9 sion to the Senate under Rule XI.

10 SEC. 4. During proceedings conducted under Rule XI
11 the chairman of the committee is authorized to waive the
12 requirement under the Rules of Procedure and Practice in the
13 Senate When Sitting on Impeachment Trials that questions
14 by a Senator to a witness, a manager, or counsel shall be
15 reduced to writing and put by the presiding officer.

16 SEC. 5. In addition to a certified copy of the transcript
17 of the proceedings and testimony had and given before it, the
18 committee is authorized to report to the Senate a statement
19 of facts that are uncontested and a summary, with appropri-
20 ate references to the record, of evidence that the parties have
21 introduced on contested issues of fact.

22 SEC. 6. Necessary expenses of the committee shall be
23 paid from the contingent fund of the Senate from the appro-
24 priation account "Miscellaneous Items" upon vouchers ap-
25 proved by the chairman of the committee.

1 SEC. 7. The Secretary shall notify the House of Repre-
2 sentatives and counsel for Judge Alcee L. Hastings of this
3 resolution.

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
