UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Ordered, That, effective on Tuesday, December 17, 1963, immediately after the prayer and approval of the Journal, the Senate go into executive session for the consideration of the treaty (Ex. N, 88th Cong., 1st sess.) with Mexico for solution of the problem of the Chamizal, and that debate thereon be limited not to exceed 2 hours to be equally divided and controlled by the majority and minority leaders, or someone designated by them. *Provided*, That final vote on the resolution of ratification be taken not later than 2 p.m. tomorrow.
