## Unanimous Consent Agreement

*Ordered,* That at the conclusion of morning business on Thursday, November 5, 1987, the Senate go into executive session to consider the Regulations for the Prevention of Pollution by Garbage from Ships (Treaty Cal. No. 3) and that the treaty be considered as having been passed through its various parliamentary stages up to and including the presentation of the resolution of ratification and that there be 20 minutes for debate on the resolution to be equally divided and controlled by the Majority and Minority Leaders or their designees;

*Provided, further,* That one amendment to the resolution by the Senator from Texas (Mr. Bentsen) be in order, with 20 minutes for debate to be equally divided and controlled in the usual form;

*Provided, further,* That no further amendments be in order and that the Senate proceed to vote on the resolution to the treaty without further debate;

*Provided, further,* That on any debatable motion, appeal or point of order there be 10 minutes for debate; and that there be no time for debate on a motion to reconsider.
