## Unanimous Consent Agreement

*Ordered,* That at 9:40 a. m. on Friday, November 6, 1987, the Senate go into executive session to consider the Fisheries Agreement with Certain Pacific Island States (Treaty Cal. No. 4) and that the treaty be considered as having passed through its various parliamentary stages up to and including the presentation of the resolution of ratification; that there be 20 minutes for debate on the resolution to be equally divided and controlled in the usual form, with a vote on the resolution at 10 a. m.; and that following the vote the Senate return to legislative session;

*Provided,* That on any debatable motion, appeal or point of order there be 10 minutes for debate.
