#### Unanimous Consent Agreement

Ordered, That at 2:15 p.m. on Tuesday, May 14, 1991, the Senate proceed to the consideration, en bloc, of the resolutions of advice and consent to ratification to four treaties on the Executive Calendar (Treaty Calendar Nos. 2 through 5); that there be ten minutes for debate to be equally divided amd controlled by the Chairman and Ranking Member of the Committee on Foreign Relations or their designees; that no amendments, reservations, or understandings--other than those recommended by the Committee and already agreed to--be in order; and that no motions to recommit be in order;

*Provided, further,* That there be one vote, to count as four votes, on the four treaties; that the President be immediately notified of the action of the Senate; and that the Senate return to legislative session after the vote.
