### Unanimous Consent Agreement

*Ordered*, That at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, June 21, 1995, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Henry W. Foster, Jr. to be Surgeon General (Cal. No. 174); that there be 3 hours for debate equally divided in the usual form and that at 12 noon on Wednesday, June 21, 1995 the Senate vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination with the mandatory quorum under Rule 22 being waived;

*Ordered, further*, If cloture is invoked, the Senate immediately begin post-cloture debate under the provisions of Rule 22.

*Ordered, further*, That if cloture is not invoked, the Senate return to legislative session, and at 12 noon on Thursday, June 22, the Senate return to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination; that there be 2 hours for debate equally divided in the usual form and at 2 p.m. the Senate vote on the second motion to invoke cloture on the nomination; with the mandatory quorum under Rule 22 being waived.

*Ordered, further*, That if cloture is invoked, the Senate immediately begin debate post-cloture under the provisions of Rule 22.

*Ordered, further*, That if cloture is not invoked on the nomination, the nomination be immediately returned to the calendar and the Senate return to legislative session, all without any intervening action or debate.
