Unanimous Consent Agreements

Ordered, That there be six hours for debate on Monday, February 9, 1998, on the nominations on the Executive Calendar of David Satcher, of Tennessee, to be an Assistant Secretary of Health and Human Services and to be Surgeon General, to be equally divided between the Senator from Vermont (Mr. Jeffords) and the Senator from Missouri (Mr. Ashcroft) and on Tuesday morning, prior to the cloture vote there will be one hour of debate equally divided in the same manner.

Ordered, further, That the cloture vote occur at 11:00 a.m. on Tuesday, February 10, 1998, with the mandatory quorum being waived, and, if cloture is invoked, the Senate proceed to an immediate vote, all without any intervening action or debate.

Ordered, further, That following the vote, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate resume legislative session.

(February 5, 1998)

Ordered, That the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Democratic Leader may proceed to executive session for consideration of Executive Calendar No. 135, Margaret M. Morrow, of California, to be United States District Judge for the Central District of California.

Ordered, further, That the nomination be considered under the following time limitation; 4 hours for debate on the nomination with the Senator from Missouri (Mr. Ashcroft) in control of 2 hours, and the remaining 2 hours divided with the Senator from California (Mrs. Boxer) in control of 45 minutes and 1 hour 15 minutes equally divided between the Senator from Utah (Mr. Hatch) and the Senator from Vermont (Mr. Leahy).

Ordered, further, That following the expiration or yielding back of time the Senate proceed to a vote on the confirmation of the nomination and that following the vote the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate then return to legislative session.
