UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Ordered, That on Friday, September 21, 2001, immediately following the convening of the Senate at 9:00 a.m., the Senate proceed to executive session to consider en bloc the nominations of Sharon Prost, of the District of Columbia, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Federal Circuit (Cal. No. 360) and Reggie B. Walton, of the District of Columbia, to be United States District Judge for the District of Columbia (Cal. No. 361).

Ordered further, That there be 20 minutes for debate on the two nominations, divided equally between the Chairman (Mr. Leahy) and the Ranking Member (Mr. Hatch) of the Committee on the Judiciary; that at the conclusion, or yielding back of time, the Senate vote on each nomination; that upon the disposition of these nominations the President be notified immediately of the Senate's action; and that the Senate return to legislative session.
