## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

### Assistant Secretary of the Army for Civil Works

*Ordered*, That when the nomination for the Assistant Secretary of the Army for Civil Works is received by the Senate, it be referred to the Committee on Armed Services, provided that when the Committee on Armed Services reports the nomination, it be referred to the Committee on Environment and Public Works for a period of 20 days of session;

*Ordered further*, That if the Committee on Environment and Public Works does not report the nomination within those 20 days, the Committee be discharged from further consideration of the nomination and the nomination be placed on the Executive Calendar. (March 11, 2003.)

### Theresa Lazar Springmann

*Ordered*, That at 6 p.m. on Monday, March 31, 2003, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider (Cal. No. 77) the nomination of Theresa Lazar Springmann, of Indiana, to be United States District Judge for the Northern District of Indiana; that the Senate then vote on the confirmation of the nomination; that following the vote, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action; and that the Senate return to legislative session.

### Timothy M. Tymkovich

*Ordered*, That at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, April 1, 2003, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider (Cal. No. 55) the nomination of Timothy M. Tymkovich, of Colorado, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Tenth Circuit; that there be 6 hours for debate, equally divided in the usual form; that, upon conclusion of debate, the Senate vote on the confirmation of the nomination, with no further intervening action or debate.

*Ordered further*, That following the vote, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action; and that the Senate then return to legislative session. (March 27, 2003)
