## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

### [ALBERTO R. GONZALES (C. 8)]

*Ordered*, That on Thursday, February 3, 2005, following morning business, the Senate resume consideration of the nomination of Alberto R. Gonzales, of California, to be Attorney General, and there be 8 hours for debate equally divided between the Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary (Mr. Specter) and the Ranking Member (Mr. Leahy) or their designees; provided further, that during the first two hours of debate, the first 30 minutes be under the control of the Majority, and following that, the time alternate every 30 minutes.

*Ordered further*, That following the use or yielding back of time the Senate proceed to a vote on the confirmation of the nomination with no intervening action or debate and that following the vote the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action.
