UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Alice S. Fisher (Cal. No. 171)

Ordered, That at 2:15 on Tuesday, September 19, 2006, the Senate proceed to executive session for the consideration of the nomination of Alice S. Fisher, of Virginia, to be an Assistant Attorney General; provided further, that there be 90 minutes under the control of the Senator from Michigan (Mr. Levin), 30 minutes under the control of the Senator from Vermont (Mr. Leahy), and 90 minutes under the control of the Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary (Mr. Specter) or his designee plus one hour under the control of the Democratic Leader and one hour under the control of the Majority Leader and the Senator from Kentucky (Mr. McConnell); provided further, that following the use or yielding back of time the Senate proceed to a vote on the confirmation of the nomination, with no intervening action or debate and that following the vote the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate resume legislative session.
