The Vici President shall be exo ficio President of the Senate, except when they sit to try the impeachment of the President in which case the chief Justice shall preside; and excepting, also, when he shall exercise the powers and duties of President, in which case, and in case, of his absure, the Senate shall choose a President pro tempore. Her The Vice President, when acting as President of the Senate, Shall not have a vote, unlighthe House be equally divided. "Sect. 4. The President, by and weith the advice and consent of the Senate, shall have hower to make Treaties: and he shall nom mate, and by and weth Hu advice and Consent of the Senate, shall appoint abapators, and other publick Ministers, Judges of the Supreme Court, and all other officers of the United States, whose appointments are not otherwise herein provided for. But no Treaty, except Treaties of Peace, shall be made without the coment of two third of the Members present.
