Sir.

The circumstances under which we find ourselves at this place undering inconvenient the mode heretofore practised of making, by present about the first communications between the legislation and Executive tranches I have adopted that by Mepage, as used on all subsequent occasions through the session in doing this I have had principal regard to the convenience of the legislature, to the economy of their time, to their relief from the embarrasment of immediate answers on subjects not yet fully before them, and to the benefits thence resulting to the put lie affairs trusting that a procedure founded in these motives, will meet their approbation, I beg leave through you, dir, to communicate the inclosed mepage, with the socuments accompanying it, to the honorable the Senate, and pray you to accept, for yourself and them, the homage of my high respect and consideration.—
