RESOLUTION

1 *Resolved*, That in addition to the authority conferred
2 upon the special committee of the Senate to investigate air
3 mail and ocean mail contracts, created under S.Res. 349,
4 Seventy-second Congress, second session, agreed to February
5 25, 1933, and supplemented by S.Res. 94, Seventy-third
6 Congress, first session, agreed to June 10, 1933, and for
7 carrying out the objects of such resolutions, the committee
8 shall have authority (1) to make full investigation of the
9 minutes, stockholdings, and financial transactions with each
10 other or with the Government of all individuals, associations,
11 partnerships, or corporations engaged in the business of
12 carrying air mail or ocean mail or the manufacture of air-

1 craft, aircraft engines, parts or accessories thereof, and of all
2 associations, partnerships, or corporations associated directly
3 or indirectly with any of such associations, partnerships, or
4 corporations, by stockholdings, interlocking directorates, or
5 contracts by, between, or through intermediate corporations
6 or individuals, or otherwise: and (2) to investigate fully all
7 contracts and relations with each other and with Government
8 officials or departments, of any such individual, association,
9 partnership, or corporation: and be it further
10 *Resolved*, That the limit of expenditures under such
11 resolutions is hereby increased by \$20,000.
