This is to certify that, in pursuance of the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "An Act to regulate the Times & Manner of holding elections for Senators in Congress." Approved July 25th 1866, an election was held, by the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, on the 3rd day of February, A.D. 1874, for a United States Senator for the term commencing March 4th 1875, ending, March 4th 1881, & S. W. Bruce having received a majority of all the votes cast, was duly & constitutionally declared elected for said term.

Wherefore, I, Adalbert Ames,

Governor of the State aforesaid, have hereunto set my hand & caused the Great Seal of the State to be hereunto affixed, at the City of Jackson this Fifth day of February A.D. 1874.
