UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Ordered, that when the Senate proceeds to the consideration of certain Legal Services Corporation nominations on the Executive Calendar (Cal. Nos. 845, 846, 847, 848, 851 and 852), these nominations be considered en bloc, under the following time argeement: one hour on the nominations en bloc to be equally divided between the Chairman of the Committee on Labor and Human Resources and the ranking minority member or their designees; that following the conclusion or yielding back of the time, the Senate proceed to vote on the nominations; and that following the vote on the nominations en bloc and after the tabling of the motion to reconsider the vote and the immediate informing of the President, if so ordered, the Senate resume legislative session.
