*Ordered, further*, that if a roll call vote is ordered on the resolution of ratification it occur at 11 a. m. on Tuesday, March 8, 1983, with one hour for debate prior to the vote, to be equally divided and controlled by the Senator from Kansas (Mrs. Kassebaum) and the ranking minority member or their designees.

*Ordered*, that on Thursday, March 3, 1983, at 12 noon, the Senate go into executive session to consider the Amendment to the 1972 Protocol to the 1928 Convention Concerning International Expositions (Treaty Cal. No. 3) with 20 minutes for debate on the resolution of ratification, with the time to be equally divided and controlled by the Chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee and the ranking minority member or their designees, with the proviso that no further understandings, reservations, conditions, declarations and statements to the resolution be in order.
