#### MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Ordered, further, that the vote occur on the resolutions to accompany Treaty Cal. Nos. 16 through 18 and 21 and 22 immediately following the debate on Thursday, with one vote counting as five votes:

Ordered, further, that following this vote, the Senate proceed to vote on the resolutions to accompany Treaty Cal. Nos. 24 through 31, with one vote counting as eight votes:

Ordered, further, that following this vote, the Senate proceed to vote on the resolutions to accompany Treaty Cal. Nos. 32 and 33, with one vote counting as two votes; and

Ordered, further, that following this vote, the Senate proceed to a vote on the resolution to accompany Treaty Cal. No. 34;

*Provided*, that it not be in order to consider any other matter except the treaties and resolutions thereto as enumerated in this agreement.
