MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION

June 26, 1986-- Motion made to reconsider the vote by which the confirmation of the nomination of Daniel A. Manion to be U. S. Circuit Judge for the Seventh Circuit was approved (yeas and nays ordered)—Mr. Byrd.

UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Ordered, that at 2 p. m. on Tuesday, July 15, 1986, the Senate go into executive session to consider the nomination of Terrence M. Scanlon to be Chairman of the Consumer Product Safety Commission, with a two-hour limitation on debate to be equally divided and controlled between the Chairman of the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation and the Ranking Minority Member or their designees; and

Ordered, further, that no motion to recommit be in order, and that following the conclusion or yielding back of time for debate, the Senate proceed to vote on the nomination.
