Unanimous Consent Agreement

Ordered, That at not later than 2 p. m. on Friday, October 23, 1987, the Senate proceed to an up and down vote on the confirmation of the nomination of Robert H. Bork to be an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States; that there be no time for debate on a motion to reconsider the vote; that on the final disposition of the nomination the President be immediately notified of the action of the Senate; and that the Senate, without further debate or action, return to legislative session; and

Ordered, further, That the time between 9 a. m. and 2 p. m. be divided, with three hours for the proponents, to be controlled by the Senator from South Carolina (Mr. Thurmond), and two hours for the opponents of the nomination, to be controlled by the Senator from Delaware (Mr. Biden);

Provided, further, That, from the time of the proponents, the Senator from Missouri (Mr. Danforth) be allotted one hour; and that from the time of the opponents, the Senator from Montana (Mr. Melcher) be allotted not to exceed 20 minutes, the Senator from Nebraska (Mr. Exon) be allotted not to exceed 15 minutes, and the Senator from Alabama (Mr. Heflin) be allotted not to exceed 15 minutes.
