Unanimous Consent Agreement

Ordered, That at 11:30 a. m. on Tuesday, November 17, 1987, the Senate go into executive session to consider the International Wheat Agreement, 1986 (Treaty Cal. No. 5) and that the treaty be considered as having passed through its various parliamentary stages up to and including the presentation of the resolution of advice and consent to ratification; that there be 30 minutes for debate on the resolution to be equally divided and controlled in the usual form, with a vote on the resolution without intervening motion or action, at 12 noon; and that following the vote the Senate return to legislative session;

Provided, That on any debatable motion, appeal or point of order there be 10 minutes, equally divided, for debate; and that on any motion to reconsider there be no time for debate.
