Unanimous Consent Agreements

Ordered, That (provided that the nomination and report have been filed on Monday, February 1, 1988) at 9:30 a. m. on Wednesday, February 3, 1988, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Anthony M. Kennedy to be an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States, and that there be one hour for debate, with the time to be equally divided and controlled by the Senator from Delaware (Mr. Biden) and the Senator from South Carolina (Mr. Thurmond), to be followed by a vote on the nomination at 10:30 a. m.:

Ordered, further, That there be no time for debate on a motion to reconsider, and that on the disposition of the nomination the Senate return to legislative session without further action, motion or debate.

(January 28, 1988)

Ordered, That at such time as the Senate proceeds to the consideration of two ILO treaties on the Executive Calendar (Cal. Nos. 6 and 7) there be 30 minutes for debate on each of the treaties, to be equally divided and controlled by the Chairman and Ranking Member of the Committee on Foreign Relations or their designees, and that following the yielding back or expiration of time for debate, that no amendments or motions to recommit be in order, and that without intervening action, the Senate proceed to back—to—back votes on the conventions;

Ordered, further, That the call for the regular order be automatic upon the expiration of 15 minutes for each vote.
