#### Unanimous Consent Agreement

Ordered, That (provided that the nomination and report have been filed on Monday, February 1, 1988) at 9:30 a. m. on Wednesday, February 3, 1988, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Anthony M. Kennedy to be an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States, and that there be one hour for debate, with the time to be equally divided and controlled by the Senator from Delaware (Mr. Biden) and the Senator from South Carolina (Mr. Thurmond), to be followed by a vote on the nomination at 10:30 a. m.;

Ordered, further, That there be no time for debate on a motion to reconsider, and that on the disposition of the nomination the Senate return to legislative session without further action, motion or debate.
