Unanimous Consent Agreements

Ordered, That at 11:30 a.m., on Tuesday, March 7, 1989, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of John Goodwin Tower to be Secretary of Defense (Cal. No. 41).

(March 6, 1989)

Ordered, That on Tuesday, March 7, 1989, at 4 p.m., the Senate proceed to consider the nomination of Thomas R. Pickering to be U. S. Ambassador to the United Nations (Cal. No. 36), under a time agreement of 20 minutes equally divided and controlled by the Senator from Rhode Island (Mr. Pell) and the Senator from North Carolina (Mr. Helms), or their designees; provided that no motions be in order, that no call for regular order serve to displace the nomination, and that following the using or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed without any intervening action to a 15 minute vote on the nomination. (yeas and nays ordered)

Provided further, That upon the disposition of the nomination, the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table, the President be immediately notified of the confirmation of the nomination, and the Senate return to the consideration of the nomination of John G. Tower to be Secretary of Defense.
