## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

*Ordered,* That when the Senate proceeds to the consideration of the nomination of Richard R. Burt for the rank of Ambassador during his tenure of service as Head of Delegation on Nuclear and Space Talks and Chief Negotiator on Strategic Nuclear Arms (START), there be one hour of debate, to be equally divided and controlled between the Chairman and Ranking Member of the Committee on Foreign Relations or their designees; and at the conclusion or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed, without any intervening business, to a vote on the nomination; that the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action on the nomination; and that the Senate return to legislative session.
