## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

*Ordered,* That when the Senate proceeds to the consideration of the nomination of A. Lamar Alexander to be Secretary of Education (Cal. No. 24) there be two hours of debate, equally divided between the Chairman and Ranking Member of the Committee on Labor and Human Resources or their designees; that at the conclusion or yielding back of time the Senate proceed, without any intervening action, to vote on the nomination; that the motion to reconsider be tabled; that the President be immediately notified of the action of the Senate on the nomination; and that the Senate return to legislative session.
