UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Ordered, That when the Senate turns to the consideration of the nomination of Strobe Talbott to be Ambassador at Large and Special Adviser to the Secretary of State on the New Independent States (Cal. No. 53), there be 40 minutes of debate, equally divided between the Chairman of the Committee on Foreign Relations (Mr. Pell) or his designee and the Senator from Arizona (Mr. McCain); that at the conclusion or yielding back of time, a vote occur on the nomination, without any intervening action; that the motion to reconsider the vote be laid upon the table; that the President be immediately notified of the action of the Senate; and that the Senate return to legislative session.
