Unanimous Consent Agreements

Ordered. That it be in order for the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Minority Leader, to proceed to the consideration of the following nominations on Monday, August 2, 1993:

-Thomas W. Payzant to be Assistant Secretary for Elementary and Secondary Education, Department of Education (Ex. Cal. No. 273) with two hours for debate to be divided and controlled in the usual form between the Senator from Massachusetts (Mr. Kennedy) and the Senator from Kansas (Mrs. Kassebaum), or their designees;

--Sheldon Hackney to be Chairperson of the National Endowment for the Humanities for a term of four years (Ex. Cal. No. 274) with five hours for debate to be divided and controlled in the usual form between the Senator from Massachusetts (Mr. Kennedy) and the Senator from Kansas (Mrs. Kassebaum), or their designees; and

--Ruth Bader Ginsburg to be an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States (Ex. Cal. No. 308):

Ordered, further, That if a roll call vote is requested on any of these nominations that the vote occur, without any intervening action, immediately following the roll call vote on the passage of H. R. 2010, the National Service Act, on Tuesday, August 3, 1993, with the order of votes to be determined by the Majority Leader after consultation with the Minority Leader;

Ordered, further, That the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Minority Leader, may proceed at any time to the nomination of Walter Dellinger to be an Assistant Attorney General (Ex. Cal. No. 288); and

Ordered, further, That upon confirmation of any of these nominees, the motion to reconsider be tabled and the President notified of the action of the Senate.

(Friday, July 30, 1993)

Ordered, That the Senate go into executive session following the vote on H. R. 2010 on August 3, 1993, to vote on the nomination of Ruth Bader Ginsburg, to be followed by votes on the nominations of Thomas W. Payzant and Sheldon Hackney; that all of the above occur without intervening action or debate; and that upon conclusion of the last vote in the sequence, the Senate return to legislative session.
