No. 315); that there be 10 minutes for debate divided and controlled in the usual form between the Senator from Delaware (Mr. Biden) and the Senator from Utah (Mr. Hatch); that when all time is used or yielded back, the Senate vote without any intervening action on the nomination; and

Ordered, further, That upon confirmation the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table and the President be notified of the Senate's action.
