## Unanimous Consent Agreements

*Ordered,* That the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Minority Leader, may proceed at any time to the nomination of Walter Dellinger to be an Assistant Attorney General (Ex. Cal. No. 288); and

*Ordered,* That upon confirmation of the nominee, the motion to reconsider be tabled and the President notified of the action of the Senate.

*(Friday, July 30, 1993)*

*Ordered,* That the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Minority Leader, may, at any time, turn to consideration of the nomination of Louis J. Freeh to be Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (Ex. Cal. No. 315); that there be 10 minutes for debate divided and controlled in the usual form between the Senator from Delaware (Mr. Biden) and the Senator from Utah (Mr. Hatch); that when all time is used or yielded back, the Senate vote without any intervening action on the nomination; and

*Ordered, further,* That upon confirmation the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table and the President be notified of the Senate's action.
