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## Unanimous Consent Agreement

*Ordered,* That it be in order at any time to proceed to the nomination of Lauri Fitz-Pegado, to be Assistant Secretary of Commerce and Director General of the U.S. and Foreign Commercial Service, (Ex. Cal. 899), that the Senator from North Carolina (Mr. Faircloth) be recognized to offer a motion to recommit the nominee to the Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs, that there be 2 hours for debate on the motion to recommit, to be divided as follows: one hour controlled by the Chairman of the Banking Committee and the Chairman of the Commerce Committee, or their designees, and one hour under the control of the Senator from North Carolina (Mr. Faircloth), or his designee, that following the conclusion or yielding back of time, the Senate vote on the motion to recommit without any intervening action; that if the motion is not adopted, the Senate then vote on the nomination, without any intervening action or debate; that if confirmed the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table and the President be notified of the Senate's action.

*Ordered, further,* That the Senate proceed to executive session at 9:30 a.m. to consider the nomination of Lauri Fitz-Pegado pursuant to the above agreement.
