Unanimous Consent Agreement

Ordered, That on Thursday, August 11, 1994, after the disposition of the Department of Defense appropriations bill, the Senate proceed to Executive Session and consideration of the nomination of Janet L. Yellin to be a Member of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System (Cal. No. 1117); that there be 45 minutes for debate, divided as follows:

15 minutes under the control of the Chairman of the Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs, or his designee;

15 minutes under the control of the Ranking Member or his designee; and

15 minutes under the control of the Senator from North Dakota (Mr. Dorgan) or his designee;

Ordered, further, That when time is used or yielded back, the Senate, without any intervening action, vote on the nomination; that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be tabled and the President be immediately notified of the action of the Senate; and that the Senate return to legislative session.
