Unanimous Consent Agreements

Ordered, That at 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, April 30, 1998, the Senate proceed to Executive Session to resume consideration of the NATO Enlargement Treaty and the Craig Amendment 2316; further that at 12 noon the Craig amendment be temporarily set aside and the Senate proceed to an amendment by Senator Moynihan relating to membership deferral and there be 1 hour for debate, equally divided, and following the conclusion or yielding back of time, the amendment be laid aside and Senator Warner be recognized to offer an amendment relating to a 3 year pause, on which there be 2 hours for debate, equally divided and following the conclusion or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed to a vote, at approximately 3:00 p.m., on or in relation to the Moynihan amendment to be followed by a vote on or in relation to the Warner amendment, following 2 minutes of debate equally divided in the usual form, prior to each vote; to be followed by a vote on or in relation to the Craig amendment 2316.

Ordered, further, That the following amendments, declarations, and conditions be the only remaining in order, other than the pending amendments and following the disposition of the listed issues, there be 90 minutes of closing debate, equally divided, and the Senate proceed to vote on the committee reported amendment as amended, to be followed by a vote on the resolution of ratification, all without further action or debate:
