## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

*Ordered*, That on Monday, March 18, 2002, at 5:30 p.m., the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Randy Crane, of Texas, to be United States District Judge for the Southern District of Texas (Cal. No. 705), and that there be 30 minutes of debate divided equally between the Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary (Mr. Leahy) and the Ranking Member (Mr. Hatch).

*Ordered further*, That the Senate vote on the nomination without any intervening action or debate and that following the disposition of the nomination, the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action; and the Senate return to legislative session.
