## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

*Ordered*, That at 9:45 a.m., on September 12, 2002, following the prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Timothy J. Corrigan, of Florida, to be United States District Judge for the Middle District of Florida (Cal. No. 960), with the time until 10:00 a.m. be equally divided between the Chairman of the Committee on Judiciary (Mr. Leahy, VT) and the Ranking Member (Mr. Hatch, UT), prior to the vote on the nomination at approximately 10:00 a.m., with no intervening action.

*Ordered further*, That upon the disposition of the nomination the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action; and that the Senate return to legislative session.

### YEAS AND NAYS ORDERED

A further request by Mr. Reid that it be in order to ask for the yeas and nays on the nomination. On request by Mr. Reid and with a sufficient second, the yeas and nays were ordered on the confirmation of the nomination.
