## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

*Ordered*, That at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, March 6, 2003, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of Miguel A. Estrada, of Virginia, to be United States Circuit Judge for the District of Columbia Circuit.(Cal. No. 21)

*Ordered further*, That the time until 10:30 a.m. be equally divided between the Chairman and Ranking Member of the Committee on the Judiciary or their designees;

*Ordered further*, That at 10:30 a.m. the Senate proceed to the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination;

*Ordered further*, That the mandatory quorum call under Rule XXII be waived.

*Ordered*, That when the Senate resumes consideration of The Moscow Treaty (Treaty Doc. 107-8)(Cal. No. 1); that the treaty be advanced through its various parliamentary stages up to and including the presentation of the resolution of ratification, that all committee recommended conditions and declarations be considered and agreed to; and

*Ordered further*, That all amendments to the resolution of ratification be relevant; that following the disposition of relevant amendments and the conclusion of debate on the resolution, the Senate immediately proceed to a vote on the adoption of the resolution of ratification, as amended, with no further intervening action or debate; and

*Ordered further*, That following the vote the President be notified of the Senate's action.
