UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

NATO Expansion Treaty (Treaty Cal. No. 6)

Ordered, That at 12:00 noon Wednesday, May 7, 2003, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the Protocols to North Atlantic Treaty of 1949 on Accession of Bulgaria, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Romania, Slovakia, and Slovenia.

Ordered further, That the treaty be considered as having passed through its various parliamentary stages up to and including the presentation of the resolution of ratification; that the 9 committee declarations and 3 understandings be considered agreed to; that there be 4 hours for debate equally divided between the Chairman of the Committee on Foreign Relations (Mr. Lugar) and Ranking Member (Mr. Biden); that the only amendments in order be the following:

Warner/Levin/Roberts — Consensus and Suspension - 90 minutes

Dodd — Administrative Structure - 60 minutes.

Ordered further, That relevant second degree amendments be in order and limited to 60 minutes; provided that following the disposition of the above amendments and the use or yielding back of time, the resolution of ratification be temporarily set aside.

Ordered further, That at 9:30 a.m. on Thursday, May 8, 2003, the Senate proceed to a vote on the adoption of the resolution of ratification. (May 5,6, 2003.)

Miguel A. Estrada (Cal. No. 21) and Priscilla Richman Owen (Cal. No. 86)

Ordered, That relative to the cloture motions presented on the nominations of Miguel A. Estrada and Priscilla Richman Owen, the mandatory quorum provided for under Rule XXII be waived. (May 6, 2003.)
