Ordered, That on Tuesday, May 20, 2008 at 12 noon, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the following nominations; with the debate time equally divided and controlled between the Chairman and the Ranking Member of the Committee on the Judiciary or their designees, until 12:30 p.m.:

Michael G. McGinn, of MN, to be United States Marshal for the District of Minnesota;

Ralph E. Martinez, of FL, to be a Member of the Foreign Claims Settlement Commission of the United States; and

G. Steven Agee, of VA, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Fourth Circuit.

Ordered further, That the nominees be debated concurrently; and at 2:15 p.m., there be 15 additional minutes equally divided and controlled between the Senators from Virginia (Mr. Webb and Mr. Warner) or their designees; that at 2:30 p.m., the Senate proceed to vote on confirmation of the nomination of G. Steven Agee, that upon confirmation of the Agee nomination, the nominations of Michael G. McGinn and Ralph E Martinez be confirmed by consent, and the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table; that the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action; no further motions be in order; and the Senate then resume legislative session.
